120 E. Main Street—The Moravian Congregational Store

One of the oldest buildings on Main Street in Lititz is 120 E. Main. Its history goes back nearly to the founding of the town in 1756. Built in 1762 the building served as the Moravian congregational general store for almost one hundred years.

The first storekeeper was Matthew Tschady (Tshudy) followed by Jasper Payne, an Englishman who conducted the store for his own enterprise. Payne handed the business back to the church but continued to run it until 1778. John Becker, the town baker by trade, took over the store for the church until 1845. At that time the store was sold to Nathaniel Wolle. He was the owner for more than half a century. During Wolle's time, a brick addition was built on the eastern wall of the store. Today this address is 122 E. Main Street. The general store was moved into this new addition and the old building became a private dwelling.

The original walls of the building are of local limestone. In 1845, when Mr. Wolle was the proprietor, stucco was applied and covered the beautiful gray stone. That same year the Moravian Church and Brother's House were also stuccoed.

During the years 1777-1778, when Revolutionary War soldiers were sent to Lititz to recover from wounds and fatigue, several of the officers were housed above the store.

In April of 1987 the owners of 120 E. Main Street, A.J. Sandwood Antiques, decided to give the old building a face lift. Workers removed the stucco in one day and exposed the original stone structure. The stone was repointed and the door and windows were brought back as closely as possible to their 1762 appearance.

Once again the forward thinking property owners in Lititz had restored yet another part of our beloved Moravian history.
